

Washington/Idaho News

Washington:

- WDFW has reprinted an article from the January issue of *Northwest Sportsman Magazine* that is a wealth of information on Rufus Woods Lake. It describes access and camping spots, licensing and permit requirements, and the best times of year to go to pursue the legendary Rufus Woods rainbows. - Monofilament recycling tubes are located at many WDFW access sites in the area. Used mono and tippet materials put into these bins gets recycled or disposed of properly, rather than left lying around to tangle up fish and wildlife. Use 'em!

Idaho

- The successful IDFG South Fork Clearwater Steelhead broodstock collection program kicks off 1/31 and runs until they reach their collection goals. This year, over 12,000 smolts from the program returned to the South Fork, the best return ever. If you're down there, hook up with one of the crews to see how to help.
- Idaho Fish and Game will be hosting six public meetings for anglers to provide comments and opinions for spring/summer Chinook salmon fisheries. The meetings are slated for February, are free to attend, and (best of all) complimentary pizza and beverages will be provided. The closest meetings to Spokane are at IDFG Regional Offices in Coeur d'Alene (February 10) and Lewiston (February 12). Meetings begin at 5:30 last until all angler comments are heard and the pizza is gone, roughly 2 hours.

FIX OF THE MONTH

Skwala Stonefly

February 2025

Montana Trout Outfitters

This low-profile Skwala is a favorite of anglers on the Bitteroot and Clark Fork. It looks like a good Skwala year may be in store, tie some up! A wonderful Youtube is at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QoiIJ0Yq7nY

Hook: Size 10 Daiichi 1260 or equivalent

Thread: Olive dun 6/0

Underbody and egg sac: 2mm black foam


Body: Montana Fly Co Skwala Dubbing (pale yellow)


Rib: Small brown v-rib

Underwing: Dark Dun CDC Wing: White calf tail

Head and wing: Elk Hair

Silicone legs and a bright antron or foam sighter





Tie in an underwing of gray CDC, a bit longer than the body. Trim off the wacky ones. Now start your bullet head of elk hair tying in elk with the tips facing forward. Wrap it down fairly tight, and trim the butts close.

Add more dubbing between the CDC tie in and the head, and form the bullet head by pushing the elk hair tips back, and tying them down closely at the base of the underwing. Flare it nicely.

Make it look like the top picture by tying in a couple of rubber legs at the base of the wing, and put a bright sighter on top. This is a low floating fly, you'll want to see it!. Whip finish and you're done.











FFI News and Happenings

FFI's Washington State Council is expanding their spring Puget Sound event! It's now the **Washington FFI Fly Casting and Tying Fair** and it's moving to Issaquah at Pickering Barn, a city park and event space just off I-90 at the 17th Ave. exit. Both the lawns and indoor tying space at Pickering are larger than Ballinger Park north of Seattle where we have held our past three Casting Fairs. The new location is more central for FFI members south, east and north of Seattle.

Tying director Sam Matalone also will be reaching out to Washington fly tiers to fill the spacious barn at the park. It's much larger than the space at Ballinger Park. With a name like Pickering Barn, of course the place has a barn, but the cows are long gone. It's a swell venue for tiers and Sam has also invited the Seattle Atlantic Salmon Fly Tying Guild to join us for the day. Details will be out in spring, but you can expect a tying theater and demos by some of the best tiers in the Pacific Northwest.
